Working Families & Legislation

The election season has concluded for our country, but there's no time to sit back and hope for positive change. All of us need to be involved in every step of the legislative process or we'll end up not having our issues addressed. For example, Corporate Downsizing, Companies Exporting jobs, Tax Fairness, Healthcare, regulation and even deregulation.

Last year members from Maryland CWA Locals 2100, 2101, 2106, 2107, 2108 and other labor coalition supporters such as AARP traveled to Annapolis to oppose SB 813. This bill would have allowed Verizon sell the Landlines without any oversight by the Maryland PSC (Public Service Commission). We were successful in stopping this bill. What could have happened had we not gotten involved? We could all be working at a telecom such as Windstream or Centurylink that more than likely doesn't have the resources to pay us our current salary or even have our pension options eliminated. Imagine only making \$17.00 an hour with no Health benefits and no pension plan. This was just one of the bills that were introduced by Verizon that could have had MAJOR implications to every working family. In the end, it is every member's responsibility to his or her family to be informed & involved, otherwise our jobs and standard of living will be a thing of the past.
